As the year has progressed, we have seen an increasing number of toys being brought to school. These toys include Lego, teddy bears, and toy vehicles.

Year 6 High School Transitions

To begin this process, a note will be going home asking for details of which high school you intend your child to attend, whether you have made contact with the school and information you would like Nebo State School to provide. Often, the high school asks for information, including NAPLAN and Report Cards that you may have misplaced.

When you receive this letter, please return it to the office as soon as possible so we can begin collecting this information and proving it to you.

I have already been contacted by Mirani High School who have planned their first visit to Nebo. They will be coming on the 18th of August to discuss Scholarships with the students who will be attending the school. Enrolment packs will also be delivered during this time.

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From Kindy/Prep



From One/Two

Last week in the one/two classroom, we started our new units for this term. So far, we have learned about what informative texts are, experimented with sources of light, identified managed and constructed features of the school, practiced skipping with individual ropes, and started to learn skipping with a long rope. The students have come a long way with their skipping during the first week-keep practicing boys and girls. We have also learned about measuring with uniform units.








From Three/Four

We are back ready for term 3. This term we are looking at information reports in English and different materials in science. In maths we have lots to cover including shape and measurement. This week we are looking at the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, making shapes and describing their features. We have begun our new P.E unit as well and it's all about athletics.







From Five/Six

Our return to school as been as smooth as possible. The students have settled back into normal school routine and the pace of learning is quite extraordinary.

We have begun our English unit deconstructing digital informative texts. We have identified the different structural elements that support readers in navigating the text, and have written paragraphs explaining this.

In Maths, we have begun looking at Area and Perimeter of rectangles. We have used formulas to calculate these, and have compared rectangles of different sizes.

In Science, we have been looking at sources of light. As we continue on through the unit, we will begin to look at reflection and refraction, but at the moment, the students have shown a key interest in space and the solar system, so we have slightly diverged and are investigating the planets.
